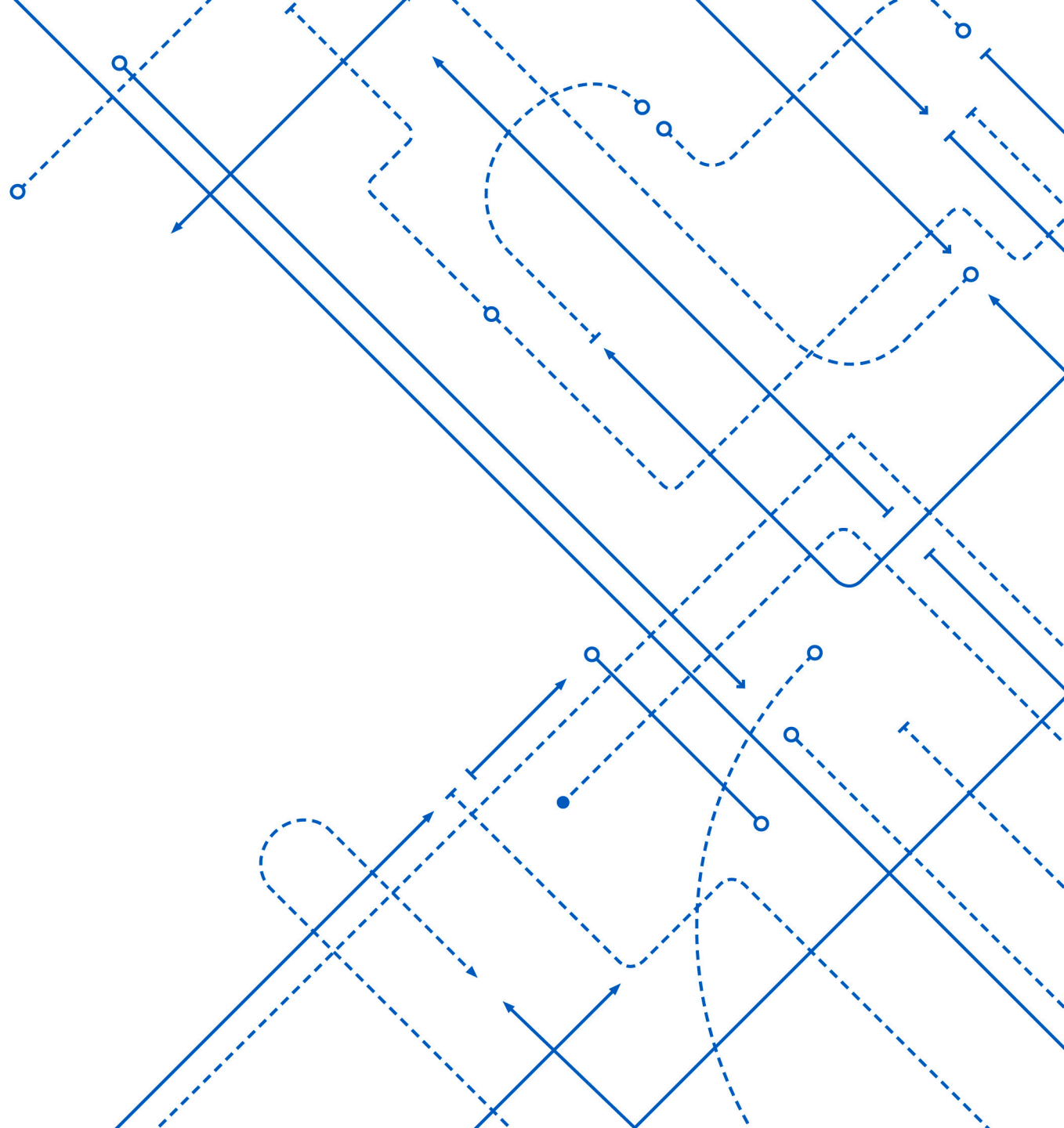

| Component | First update | Second update | Third update |
|--------------------------|--------------|---------------|--------------|
| Problem | 35 points | 20 points | 10 points |
| Solution | 0 points | 10 points | 20 points |
| Project management | 20 points | 10 points | 10 points |
| Domain Expert | 20 points | 15 points | 10 points |
| Previous results | 0 points | 10 points | 10 points |
| Current results | 10 points | 20 points | 20 points |
